* The following Greenfield Community College courses will count towards satisfying Western New England College's general College requirements: Any 100 level math course (two), any natural lab science course (two), any 100 level (3 credit) computer information systems course (one), any history course (one), GGY 101 Introduction to Geography, any foreign language course (see reverse), PSY 101 Principles of Psychology **or** SOC 101 Principles of Sociology, ECO 101 Principles of Macroeconomics, ECO 102 Principles of Microeconomics, ENG 219 Ethnic Literature **or** ENG 235 Survey of Latin American Literature.

** Any Greenfield Community College International Studies elective without an equivalent Western New England College course will transfer as a *General Elective* (up to 9 credits). The following Greenfield Community College course will satisfy a specific international studies requirement at Western New England College: MUS 137 World Music and Cultures. Additionally, students majoring in international studies are encouraged to eventually study abroad upon enrolling at Western New England College.

- 1) Western New England College may not be able to apply towards the curriculum credit that is not specified as eligible for a specific major offered through the Joint Admissions Program. Students are subject to transfer credit restrictions as noted in the Western New England College Catalogue.
- 2) Students should reference the Western New England *Academic Programs Book* to ensure the proper courses are selected. Additionally, students are encouraged to work with the academic advisors at Greenfield Community College and a transfer counselor at Western New England College when selecting electives.
- 3) Based on degree requirements for most majors at Western New England College, only one foreign language course will apply towards general education requirements. Additional foreign language courses may count as general electives. Up to three courses (9 credits) will apply towards degree requirements for International Studies at Western New England College.

* Students may have satisfied some of these requirements through elective courses taken at Greenfield Community College. To ensure that the maximum number of credits is applied towards a bachelor's degree at Western New England College, students are encouraged to select recommended courses provided on page 1 of this transfer guide.
