CORNING COMMUNITY COLLEGE 2005

General Policies

- A. Elmira College accepts a maximum of sixty-eight semester hours of credit from two-year colleges.
- B. Associate in Arts and Associate in Sciences Degrees:
 - 1.) Students who have received Associate in Arts and Associate in Sciences degrees from Corning Community College will be admitted to Elmira College as Juniors, if they have at least 54 college transfer credits.
 - 2.) Recipients of these college transfer degrees will receive credit for grades of "D", provided that; (1) the student has earned a cumulative grade point average of 2.000 or higher, (2) the courses in which the grades were earned are applicable to the degree, (3) Corning Community College recognizes the course as a college transfer course, and (4) Elmira College recognizes the course as a college transfer course (see the Elmira College Bulletin)

Any course that is included in the credits required for an Associate in Arts or Associate in Science Degree is recognized by Corning Community College as a "college transfer course" and will be so recognized by Elmira College.

- 3.) a. Students who have completed the Associate in Arts or the Associate in Sciences degree are exempt from FRS 1010 and FRS 1020, Freshman Core.
 - b. For courses that fulfill the Elmira College General Degree Requirements, see the course listing in Part C below
- 4.) Recipients of these degrees will have completed the Elmira College Communication Skills Program requirement. They will also have fulfilled the Physical Education requirement. Careful selection of electives should permit the completion of most of the other General Degree Requirements. Courses are listed below which meet specific parts of the General Degree Requirements.
- C. Associate in Applied Science Degrees: Although many courses may transfer, as listed in Section II, these degrees are not designed for transfer. Elmira College recognizes this distinction between degrees, programs and courses leading directly to careers and those that are applicable to baccalaureate degrees. With a little careful planning, a student may select courses that meet many of the general education and major requirements of Elmira College, as well as Corning Community College's requirements for the occupational degree. The specific course equivalents and major requirements are provided in Parts II and III, below, but the following guidelines may be useful to Corning Community College students who are considering transferring to Elmira College:

GENERAL DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

A. Communications Skills Program

Corning students with A. A., A. S. or A.A.S. degrees will have completed this requirement. Other Corning students must complete ENGL 1010 and ENGL 1020 (College Composition I and II). These courses must have been completed later than the summer after high school graduation. (Note: first-time freshman students, even those transferring in credits completed before or in the summer immediately after high school graduation, are expected to pursue a common Elmira College curriculum including English 1000, Communication 1001, FRS 1010 and FRS 1020, Freshman Core, and Encore 1010 and 1020.)

B. "W" Course

Every student must complete, with a passing grade, a course at Elmira College from an approved list of "W" courses. This will typically be a course, taken at Elmira College, in the student's major with a special emphasis on written communication.

C. Mathematical Competency

Completion (with a passing grade) of any of the following courses will satisfy this requirement: MATH 1210, MATH 1220, MATH 1411, MATH 1412, MATH 1413, MATH 1510, MATH 1520, MATH 1610, or MATH 1620. (Students may also satisfy this requirement through a test of elementary algebra skills or based on their ACT or SAT scores, if available)

D. Core Requirement

Students who transfer less than 54 credits must complete FRS 1010 and FRS 1020 at Elmira College.

E. Distribution Requirements

1. Culture and Civilization: 15 credits (Including at least 3, but no more than 6, credits from each of sub-groups a, b, and c below). Students may not have more than 9 credits in any one field code.

One such course by itself, although accepted for transfer credit, will not count for any portion of the European Culture and Civilization requirement)

(Note: In order for THEA 1101-1111 and THEA 2102-2112 to fulfill the Creative Process requirement, the student must be involved in a creative process, such as acting, directing or designing a set. Selling tickets, working on publicity, or working on the set will not fulfill the requirement.)

- F. Physical Education Recipients of the Corning Community College Associate in Arts or Associate in Science degree have fulfilled this requirement. Other transfer students should refer to the list of specific Corning Community College courses, which can be used to fulfill this requirement. They are found in the Physical Education and Recreation sections in the equivalent course lists in this agreement. Refer to the Elmira College Bulletin for alternative ways to fulfill this requirement.
- G. Encore or The Performing Arts Appreciation Requirement

Recipients of the Corning Community College Associate in Arts or Associate in Science degree are exempt from the Elmira College Encore requirement. Other transfer students will also be exempt if they enter Elmira College as juniors. Those students who enter Elmira College with less than 54 credits must complete the Encore requirement at the level they enter.

H. Field Experience/ Practicum

Transfer students must complete the Field Experience requirement at

Elmira College. This includes Community Service and either Career Related Field Experience or Pre-graduate School Experience. Waivers may be granted, based on prior experience, by the Elmira College Office of Career Services

I. Equivalent Courses

This part of the articulation agreement lists, by academic discipline, those courses offered by Corning Community College which may be applied toward the baccalaureate degrees (A.B. and S.B.) at Elmira College.

Corning Community College courses which do not have specific equivalents at Elmira College, but which are accepted toward an Elmira College degree are listed below as follows:

"Major Electives" (courses counting toward the total number of credits in a major but not specifically required for the major)

"General Electives" (courses counting toward the total of 120 credits needed for graduation but not counting toward any major or general degree requirement)

Corning Community College courses which are not listed below may still be included in the 60 to 68 credits accepted for transfer, even if they do not meet any of the Major, Minor, or General Degree requirements at Elmira College; however, all courses accepted in transfer must be of a generally similar nature, content and level to Elmira College courses (and must **not** be remedial or narrowly vocational)

SPECIAL MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

Equivalent General Education and Major Requirements for most Elmira College Degrees may be determined by consulting the list of courses in Part II of this agreement. However, certain majors have special requirements, which are set forth here. In this section, the terms and conditions involved in completing these majors are presented in the context of the Corning Community College Curricula, so that Corning students, who may consider transfer to Elmira College, may plan their programs more effectively.

Accounting

Elmira College's S.B. Degree in Accounting is registered by the New York State Education Department as qualifying for the CPA Licensure. Elmira College must meet the standards established by the State Board of Accountancy. For that reason, the S.B. Degree in Accounting is a highly structured major with very specific requirements. Students must complete 27 credits in Accounting, 33 credits in Business and related courses, and 60 college transfer credits in the "Liberal Arts and Sciences". To meet these standards, Elmira College limits to 12 the number of credits in Accounting, which may be transferred:

Education

Although a minimum 2.0 Grade Point Average (GPA) is required for Admission to Elmira College, acceptance into the Teacher Education Program and Student Teaching has a higher GPA requirement. Students must earn and maintain a 2.7 GPA in both their academic major and/or concentration and in their Teacher Education program courses. An application for acceptance into the Teacher Education Program must be completed by April 15th in the student's second (Sophomore) year. The Student Teaching I application is due by October 15th in the student's third (Junior) year. Transfer students who are admitted to Elmira College with Junior status must complete both applications by October 15th of their third (Junior) year.

The Liberal Arts and Sciences: Education/Childhood Education Program at Corning Community College is a jointly registered program of Corning Community College and Elmira. College.

Foreign Languages

A major in foreign languages requires completion of core requirements plus an area of specialization chosen from French or Spanish. Each specialization in a modern foreign language requires 24 credits excluding the first-year course, as specified in the Elmira College <u>Bulletin</u>. At least 12 of these credits must be at the 3000-level or higher.

Nursing

Eighteen credits in nursing are accepted to meet Elmira College Nurse Education Program requirements. Other nursing credits earned at CCC are accepted as elective credit.

Philosophy and Religion

All philosophy courses offered at Corning Community College are acceptable electives in philosophy and religion.

Social Science/Criminal Justice

Although several specific courses are equivalent, the Elmira College S.B. major in social science/criminal justice is significantly different from the Corning Community College A.A.S. Criminal Justice degree in its structure and purposes. Students who have received this degree should consult a member of the Elmira College faculty to determine their status prior to registration.

Speech and Hearing

A maximum of nine credits may be transferred as related electives based on the equivalencies listed in part II; HUSR 1560 Introduction to Special Education, (for which Elmira has no exact equivalent) may be included as a related elective at the 2000-level.

- *The Community Grant will be \$2,000 for students who live on campus at Elmira College.
- These grants and scholarships are also applicable to students enrolled in the Joint CCC-EC Education/Childhood Education major.
- These grants and scholarships are available to students transferring to Elmira College in the Fall of 2000 or later.
- There is no separate grant or scholarship application

REVISION AND CANCELLATION

This agreement may be revised or cancelled by either party at the end of any academic year, provided written notice is submitted to the other party no later than the end of the first semester of the previous year. Students who are enrolled in Elmira College shall complete their programs under the terms in force at the time of their admission.
