E. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

1. Procedures for reviewing, up-dating, modifying or terminating agreement:

Bronx Community College Business Department Chair, Dr. Rosemary Quinn, and SUNY Maritime Department of Global Business and Transportation Chair, Dr. Larry Howard, will review implementation of the agreement once a year to ensure that students are adequately informed of the program and to identify issues requiring attention.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, e.g., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

After transfer into SUNY Maritime, SUNY Maritime will track the performance of Bronx Community College students.

Additionally, these students will be surveyed after graduation from Maritime to determine educational and occupational experience and success.

All information will be shared with Bronx Community College.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

SUNY Maritime Department of Global Business and Transportation Department will coordinate with SUNY Maritime Admissions and Recruitment to make certain that materials describing the program are sent with recruiters to the biannual Transfer Day at Bronx Community College.
