Hunter College agrees to accept into the Bachelor of Arts degree program students from Borough of Manhattan Community College who successfully complete the courses in the Writing and Literature curriculum as noted below (see section B for course equivalencies), thereby receiving an Associate in Arts degree. This agreement is intended for students who are interested in pursuing a degree in English with a concentration in Writing at Hunter College. Successful completion of the Writing and Literature curriculum at Borough of Manhattan Community College includes the attainment of at least a 2.0 overall grade point average.

Borough of Manhattan Community College agrees to present the courses noted in the Writing and Literature Program as outlined in the college catalog and agrees to notify Hunter College if course numbers, content or catalog descriptions change. Furthermore, the parties involved understand that any change in course number, content or catalog description may require a modification to this agreement.

It is also understood that Borough of Manhattan Community College will identify students interested in pursuing a career in English (Writing) and notify those students of the existence of this agreement; and will recommend Hunter College to those who successfully complete the curriculum stated in this agreement.

Students who successfully complete the courses in Writing and Literature Program and receive an A.A. degree from Borough of Manhattan Community College and who transfer to Hunter College to pursue a major in the Department of English will need to complete the following requirements to graduate from Hunter College with a B.A. (120 credits) degree:

**Major in ENGLISH:**

**Sciences and Mathematics, Category I:** If PHYS 101 is completed at BMCC, then 3 credits needed. If BIOL 200 is completed at BMCC, then BIOL 102 must be taken at Hunter College.

**English Composition, Category II:** Completed

**Humanities: Foreign Language, Category III:** 6 credits, if levels 101 and 102 are completed at BMCC. The completion of this requirement also depends on the number of years of foreign language completed in high school; Hunter college has a two-year (4 semester) language requirement.

**Humanities: Literature, Category IV:** Completed

**Humanities and the Arts, Category V:** 3 credits needed to be completed at Hunter College

**Social Science, Category VI:** Completed

**College Diversity Requirement:** 12 credits. Check pp. 14-22 of the Undergraduate Catalog 1998-2000.
