Students who graduate from BMCC with an A.A.S. degree in Social Science-Early Childhood Education will have fulfilled all Lower Division General Education requirements for the Lehman College Baccalaureate degree. Students will be required to meet New York State Liberal Arts and Certification requirements as well as Lehman's Upper Division General Education requirements.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS TO UPPER DIVISION PROGRAM

Admission requirements for senior college program (e.g., minimum GPA, audition/portfolio):

Students completing the equivalent of Lehman's minor in early childhood education at BMCC must have completed a minimum of 40 hours of field work and bring a comprehensive portfolio including syllabi, work assignments, reflections, observation reports, observation logs, etc. in the 12 credits of education coursework that will be accepted for the minor. To advance to the Certification Sequence, students must have a 2.75 gpa overall and a 3.0 gpa in the 12 credits of BMCC Education coursework. Additionally, students must submit their LAST scores to meet entrance requirements to the Certification Sequence.

ECE 482 instead of ECE 481

In addition, the student must also take EDE 727(3) (for undergraduate credit) and either LNG 160 (3) or SPV (LNG) 312 (3).

Monitoring, Evaluation and Modification of this Agreement

This agreement will be monitored by tracking students as they progress through the sequence of upper division courses upon transfer. Academic performance and persistence towards the baccalaureate degree will be evaluated by the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs at Borough of Manhattan Community College and the Office of the Dean of the School of Education at Lehman College in close consultation with the faculty of the A.A.S. in Early Childhood Education and the faculty of the B.A. in Early Childhood Education Teacher.

Dissemination of this Agreement

Copies of this agreement will be available in the Department of Social Science, the Early Childhood Education Program Office, the Advisement and Transfer Office at Borough of Manhattan Community College. At Lehman College, the agreement will be available in the Academic Information and Advisement Center, the Office of the Provost, The Office of the Dean of Education, and the Office of the Department of Early Childhood and Childhood Education. Both the A.A.S. in Early Childhood Education at Borough of Manhattan Community College and the School of Education at Lehman College have full-time dedicated academic counselors available to provide information and guidance to students. College websites will also provide information regarding the articulation of these two programs.
