The School of Business at SUNY Oswego recognizes the diversity of the transfer student population. This brochure will ease the transfer process by identifying specific versus general transfer courses to Oswego. Where possible, suggestions have been made for the elective areas in order to maximize hours for transfer purposes. Also included are the remaining courses needed for all degrees in the Oswego School of Business. Although a General Articulation Agreement exists with SUNY Oswego, students must complete the cognate courses (economics, math, computer science, and communication). Only the sciences and social & behavioral sciences areas (in which we require 9 hours of 3 separate courses) are waived; thus students do not need to complete the sequence in this area, but must move the remaining hours to the A/S elective area. Additional transfer classes will cause variation in course selection at Oswego. This brochure is good for all 2-year degrees.
