#### ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

# PAINE COLLEGE and GREENVILLE TECHNICAL COLLEGE

The following information outlines an articulation agreement between Paine College and Greenville Technical College (GTC) to establish a cooperative transfer agreement between the two institutions.

The Agreement assures general admission to Paine, but not necessarily to a specific major.

Outlined below are the general conditions of the Articulation Agreement:

# Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) Requirement

a. Upon applying for admission, all students (except those wishing to pursue the Bachelor of Science degree in Education) must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.00 or better (on a 4.0 scale) in courses that satisfy either a Common Curriculum or major degree requirement once the student enrolls at Paine. Students who wish to pursue a Bachelor of Science degree in Education must have a cumulative GPA of 2.50 or better in courses that satisfy either a Common Curriculum requirement or major degree requirement once the student enrolls at Paine College. Courses in which a grade lower than "C" was earned will not be accepted. Courses for which there is no direct equivalent, but which may serve as elective credit will be evaluated on a case by case basis.

### Student's Status at Greenville Technical College

b. Students must be in good standing at Greenville Technical College with the capability of returning or must have earned the Associate degree at the time of their transfer to Paine. Good standing must be documented by receipt of the student's transcript.

#### Official Transcripts

c. Official transcripts of all postsecondary work attempted must be submitted.

#### Credit for Transfer Courses

d. All courses being used for transfer credit must meet the transfer requirements of Paine. All courses accepted for transfer credit must satisfy either a Common Curriculum requirement or major degree requirement once the student enrolls at Paine College. Courses listed in the matrix are courses offered at GTC that will be accepted towards completion of the Common Curriculum at Paine. Other courses that may or may not be accepted in the student's program of study are also listed.

# Final Decision on Receiving Credit for Transfer Courses

e. The final decision as to whether a given course is transferable will be made by Paine College.

### Enrollment at Paine College

f. The Coordinator of the Transfer Program at Paine College must be notified of the student's intent to transfer to Paine no later than two weeks prior to the first day of classes of the semester in which the student expects

to enroll. All students must submit a Paine College application in accordance with the Paine College application guidelines. The application and recommendation must be submitted at least two weeks prior to the first day of classes of the semester in which the student expects to enroll.

Coordination of the Program

g. The administration of the Program will be through a Coordinator at Paine College and a Coordinator at Greenville Technical College. These coordinators will have the overall responsibility for publicity, recruitment, advising, and the monitoring of program quality.

#### Financial Assistance

h. Paine College offers a limited number of appropriate scholarships, grants, loans, and part-time employment to assist eligible students in meeting their educational expenses. Paine College will assist students in identifying other possible sources of assistance.

Oversight of the Program

i. The chief academic officers (CAOs) of Paine College and Greenville Technical College will give general direction to and recommend policy related to this Agreement.

**Starting Date** 

j. The starting date of this Agreement between Paine College and Greenville Technical College is the semester following the signing of this Agreement by both parties.

Modifications of this Agreement

k. Paine College and Greenville Technical College agree that if modifications or deviations from this Agreement are deemed advisable, a written agreement must be entered into and signed by the President of both institutions.

### Institutional Responsibility

- 1. Paine College agrees to do the following:
  - appoint a Coordinator and inform Greenville Technical College of who has been so designated;
  - facilitate the transfer of students from Greenville Technical College who meet the eligibility requirements specified in this Agreement;
  - provide timely notification of a student's eligibility for enrollment following review of the student's completed application and transcript; and
  - ensure that Greenville Technical College is aware of the Paine College curriculum, especially the Common Core Curriculum.
- m. Greenville Technical College agrees to do the following:

- appoint a Coordinator and inform Paine College of who has been so designated;
- provide official transcripts of students; and
- promote student transferability by advising students while at Greenville Technical College to enroll in courses that will be accepted by Paine College.

# Evaluation and Review of this Agreement

.

The Registrars of Paine College and Greenville Technical College in conjunction with others appointed by the CAOs of the respective institutions will be charged with evaluation and review of this agreement.
