- 2. For students participating in the Joint Admissions Program with SUNY Brockport, maintaining continuous study, achieving a minimum 2.5 GPA and successfully completing courses as specified in this advisement guide are required. Additional GPA requirements exist for Accounting (2.5 in specified prerequisite courses), Business Administration (2.5 in specified prerequisite courses), International Business (3.0 in specified prerequisite courses), Social Work (3.0) and education certification programs (3.0). If these conditions are not met, continued participation in the program and acceptance to SUNY Brockport will be in jeopardy.
- 3. SUNY Brockport requires a grade of at least a "C" in each course used to satisfy a History major requirement.
- 4. Completion of this course does not exempt students from the computer skills exam required by SUNY Brockport.
- 5. Students interested in teaching must submit a separate application to SUNY Brockport's teacher certification program. Applications for admission to teacher certification programs are due September 15th for spring admission and February 15th for fall admission. Specific coursework and minimum 2.5 GPA are required for acceptance into the program. For additional information, go to www.brockport.edu/ehd or SUNY Brockport's catalog.
- 6. SUNY Brockport requires students complete a minimum 30-hour experience working with children in a structured, academic setting in grades 1-6 prior to applying to the Childhood Education program.
