Macomb Campus Transfer Admission Standards

For transfer students to the Macomb campus, admission standards vary depending on how many semester hours you have previously earned.

If you have earned 24 or more semester hours

Admissions standards are as follows:

- Have a combined C average for all hours attempted from all institutions attended and
- Be in good standing at the last college/university attended

If you have earned fewer than 24 semester hours

Admissions standards are as follows:

- Have a combined C average for all hours attempted from all institutions attended and
- Be in good standing at the last college/university attended and
- Meet <u>freshman admission standards</u> of 2.5 cumulative high school grade point average with ACT composite score of 20 (SAT - 940)

Quad Cities Campus Transfer Admission Standards

Admissions standards are as follows:

- Earned 60 semester hours or more and
- Cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale and
- Be in good academic standing at the last school attended

Before Arriving at WIU

- Apply to Western Illinois University
- Have your current college/university send an official final transcript to WIU admissions after your classes have been completed and recorded or a degree has been posted.

Articulation & Course Equivalencies

Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI)

Phase I

The Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) began in 1998 to assist students transferring general education course work between Illinois schools. The IAI General Education Core Curriculum (GECC) comprised of 37 to 41 semester hours is for students who are undecided about a major and which four-year school to attend. Students who transfer to Western Illinois University with IAI GECC (37-41 semester hours) verified on their official transcript will have met the University's General Education requirement. Students who have decided on a major should see below Phase II. If you have decided to transfer to WIU, you should consult the <u>WIU catalog</u> and talk to an admission counselor.

Phase II

IAI Majors identifies course work students in their first and second year would typically complete. This is for students who have decided on a major but are undecided about which four-year school to attend.
