### **Ready to Get Started?**

We'll consider you for admission if you've earned a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale for all transferable course work attempted. Courses from remedial programs, vocational and technical schools, and colleges and universities that are not regionally accredited\* cannot be transferred.

Admission decisions will be based upon your academic records at all educational institutions you've attended. You must be in good academic standing and eligible to return immediately to the last institution you attended.

If you apply for transfer admission to Ball State while you're enrolled at another college or university, you may be considered for admission on the basis of your current college or university cumulative GPA. If you're admitted to Ball State while enrolled at another college or university (referred to as "transfer admission on an incomplete transcript"), your cumulative GPA must remain above 2.0. Admission granted under such circumstances may be withdrawn if your cumulative GPA falls below 2.0.

### **For Transfer Students**

1. Complete and submit the <u>university application for undergraduate admission and</u> <u>housing</u>. Also complete required supplemental applications for <u>Special Programs</u> and submit required supporting materials.

2. Request official transcripts from all postsecondary institutions attended (colleges, universities, or vocational schools) be sent directly to the <u>Office of Admissions</u>. You also must submit an official copy of your final high school transcript or an official GED score report unless you have earned an associate's degree from an accredited college or university.

3. Submit your SAT or ACT scores to the <u>Office of Admissions</u>. If you have not taken the SAT or ACT, you may be required to do so if you have earned less than 30 hours of transferable credit, or if your cumulative grade point average is below 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. Please submit your scores if you have taken either test.

4. Submit a nonrefundable \$25 application fee. For Online applications, you may pay by a major credit card or an electronic check (ACH) payment. If applying by mail, make checks payable to Ball State University.

### **Dates and Deadlines**

Ball State reviews applications for admission on a rolling basis. Admission decisions are made after we receive all of your supporting credentials. Enrollment at Ball State and individual programs is limited, so apply early to ensure consideration for your preferred entry semester and program. Applications submitted after the priority deadlines will be considered on a space-available basis. When enrollment goals are met for each term, admission will close.

### **Priority Application Deadlines**

- March 1: Fall Semester
- December 1: Spring Semester
- April 1: Summer and First Summer Session
- May 1: Second Summer Session
