

Transfer Credit

Transfer credit is evaluated on a course by course basis under the supervision of the registrar. All academic courses in which at least a "C" grade or its equivalent has been earned may qualify for transfer if taken at a college accredited by the association for biblical higher education or the appropriate regional or national association.

Courses earned at an unaccredited college are reviewed on a case by case basis. The maximum number of transfer credits from an unaccredited institution is 30 semester credits unless the institution has signed a cooperative agreement in which case the maximum is raised to 80 semester credits. The maximum number of credits that may be transferred toward the specific major or minor core courses (e.g. the psychology core in the psychology major, etc.) is 50%. When a student has earned additional transfer credits in the major core, the registrar in consultation with the Department Chair will specify which courses will be applied toward the Crown College major.

Transfer students must meet all departmental and general college requirements for the degree in the program for which they are enrolled. Official transcripts for students with an intended major are evaluated on a course-by-course basis by the registrar's office. In most cases, students will receive a written evaluation prior to registration. The following courses have been designated by the faculty as upper level, integrative bible and theology courses that must be completed at Crown College: BLB 434 Romans, the 333X Christian Ethics, the 334X Apologetics. Therefore, transfer credit toward these requirements will not be applied. The admissions Council is authorized to make exceptions to policies governing transfer student admissions should extenuating circumstances indicate that such would be justifiable.
