

DeSales University Transfer Policy

All completed **three-credit courses from a regionally accredited institution with a grade of C- or better** will be evaluated to determine transferability into the University's major programs' curriculums

If a student has received an **A.A. or A.S. degree, all credits will be transferred** provided that student achieved a) minimum of a 2.0 cumulative GPA and b) minimum of a 2.0 GPA for courses required in and offered by the major at DSU

Only credit is transferred to the University. Grades for transfer courses are not calculated into the student's GPA at DeSales, unless the course was completed at an LVAI institution as part of the cross-registration process

To earn a DeSales University degree, students **must complete a minimum of 15 three-credit courses at DeSales University, 5 courses in the major at DeSales University, and a total of 40 three-credit courses overall.** (Programs including nursing, physician assistant studies, and education may have additional requirements)

Students may be exempt from certain parts of the University's General Education Core, based on the amount of courses that transferred:
