## Grades

- The College of Engineering will not use any courses with a grade of D toward meeting degree requirements. All courses used in engineering degrees must be graded A, B or C.
- Grades of C or higher are required in all courses labeled as foundation, professional, and supporting in College of Human Ecology degree programs.
- The grade of D will transfer to K-State. However, if the D grade was earned in a foundation course, you may be required to repeat the course so that you will be successful in subsequent courses.

## Credits

- The unit of credit at K-State is the semester hour. All incoming transcripts will be converted to semester hours. Quarter credits are converted as follows: 1 quarter hour = .67 semester hour.
- Courses accepted for transfer to K-State are college-level and academic in nature. Courses not accepted for transfer include such courses as vocational and technical, remedial and personal-interest courses. English language courses from international schools will not be accepted for transfer credit.
- Two religion courses from a religiously affiliated institution will be accepted for transfer credit.
- There is no limit on the age of the courses you have completed. Your K-State college will advise you which, if any, of the courses need to be updated to meet degree requirements.

## Transfer equivalency

The transfer of credit is determined by the educational quality of the transfer institution, the comparability of content and level of credit earned, and the applicability of credit earned to K-State's degree requirements. Most academic credits submitted from any regionally accredited two- or four-year college, community college or university are accepted by K-State.
