

# Transfer Credits:

We accept transfer credits that meet the following requirements:

- Credits were earned at a regionally accredited university or college
- The course was a 100 level or higher course (i.e. ENG 101 Freshman Composition NOT ENG 098 Preparing for College Writing)
- The student earned a C- or higher in the course
- The course covered material that is similar to subject matter offered at the University of Hartford
- We have received an official transcript from the institution at which the course was taken.
- We will accept coursework done online as long as the student can provide an official transcript from an accredited institution; the exception is that we cannot accept online lab science coursework.
- Computer courses are evaluated on their content to determine transferability. We will not accept computer courses that are more than ten years old.

## AP credits:

- Scores of 3, 4, or 5 (4 or 5 for English) are required in order to grant college credit.
- Students must have official score report sent from College Board.

## CLEP credits:

- College Level Examination Program
- Students can only earn up to 27 credits from CLEP testing
- The University of Hartford is an open test center, meaning we will allow anyone who properly registers, including military personnel, to take the CLEP tests. We offer the test every 3rd Saturday of each month in Hillyer Hall. To register, students should fill out a [registration form](#) and submit it to the Center for Graduate and Adult Academic Services.

## IB - International Baccalaureate credits:

- Students can earn up to 12 credits from IB work.

- The University of Hartford only accepts Higher Level subjects in which the students earns a score of 4-7.

Credit may also be granted for service-connected learning experiences as recommended by the A.C.E. Guide for Evaluation of Educational Experiences in the Armed Forces. A maximum of 15 credits may be earned through A.C.E.

## **Accreditation:**
