## Benefit from a liberal credit transfer policy.

The Bachelor of General Studies (BGS) degree was created to offer greater flexibility to continuing education students. Therefore, we offer the most liberal transfer policy available through UNO and will often accept transfer credit that other programs cannot. The BGS allows <u>non-traditional credit</u> for:

- some workplace training programs
- military service schools
- hospital diplomas
- and more

Plus, transfer credits are accepted from all community colleges, colleges and universities accredited by a post secondary regional association.

#### Transfer credits

- Courses with a grade of "C-" or better from a regionally accredited two- or four-year college or university will be accepted for transfer.
- A maximum of 64 semester credit hours may be transferred from community colleges.
- All credit hours transferable are converted to semester credit hours (e.g., one-quarter hour equals 2/3 of a semester credit.)

Grades earned at another institution do not become a part of the student's UNO cumulative grade point average (except those earned at another campus of the University of Nebraska: UNL, UNK, UNMC).
