Transfer of Credit

The University of Pittsburgh generally accepts credits from institutions at which the applicant has received a grade of "C" or better in college-level coursework (not remedial) that corresponds to a course in our curriculum in content and credit value. Pass/Fail courses may be accepted for transfer credit if it can be documented that a "P" grade corresponds to a grade of "C" or better.

To help facilitate the transfer of credits from Pennsylvania's community colleges, state system of higher education and other selected colleges, the University has established transfer guides (link with these at your right):

- Articulation agreements
- PA TRAC Transfer Credit Framework. PA TRAC involves a thirty credit matrix of transferable credits from institutions participating in Pennsylvania's College Transfer System. These thirty credit hours of equivalent course content are accepted as meeting general education requirements for most majors.

To receive a University of Pittsburgh degree, you must complete, at a minimum, your last 30 credits at the University of Pittsburgh. Specific graduation and other requirements for different University of Pittsburgh schools, vary. (Note: a maximum of 60 credits can transfer from a two-year degree program; and a maximum of 90 from a four-year college/university.)
